### **Sports Day**

#### **Adam Simms' Memorial Cup**

Our Key Stage 3 Athletics Team enjoyed a great day out at the Adam Simms' Memorial Cup at Quibell park, Scunthorpe. The Adam Simms Cup is an annual Athletics competition to celebrate the life of a local student who tragically lost his life in a car accident. Each team consists of 5 students, and they compete in the 100m, 800m, Long Jump and either the High Jump or Javelin. Our Y7 Girls team finished 2nd overall, competing against 7 other school. Our Y8 Boys team finished 6th overall.

In June welcomed prospective 6th form students to the academy for their induction days, which included taster sessions, ice breakers and team building activities. A lot of fun was had by all.







#### **GCSE Geography Field Trip**

In June 2023 100 GCSE Geographers in Year 10 visited Hornsea, Bridlington and Flamborough Head to collect valuable fieldwork data for their Paper 3 exam where they will answer the enquiry questions 'Are groynes effective in Hornsea?' and 'Housing quality increases further from the CBD in Bridlington'. Once the hard work was done we had time for fish and chips and ice cream before exploring Flamborough Head where we saw first-hand the erosive power of the sea and coastal landforms including caves, arches and wave cut platforms. 



























### **Paris**

In July some of our Year 9 students went on an adventure to Dallowgill in North Yorkshire. On the way to the centre they stopped at Ripley castle and they participated in a number of activities including paddle boarding, Kayaking and rafting.

#### **STEM**

The Design & Technology department took a group of students to the WiME event which was held at the Baths Hall. The girls had the opportunity to talk to a range of different employers from a range of sectors. They developed their understanding of how their interest in STEM subjects can lead to a possible future career and different pathways they could take after their finish school.





Throughout the event the students in a range of hands on activities, including using VR headsets and a quiz. In the quiz they had to ask the employers set questions about their industries and record the answers, they were then asked to answer a tie breaker question. One of our year 8 students won the competition, which over 200 students entered. The prize is a fantastic opportunity for female students to learn about the clean energy industry. A representative from Orsted will come into the academy and meet with our students.





#### **Athletics**

42 students across 4-year groups represented the Vale Academy in the annual athletics competition held at Quibell Park.



We are extremely proud of the whole team with some excellent individual performances on the day plus a great team effort from both the year 7 boys and girls relay teams who finished 1st or 2nd on the day.





#### **Poetry**

In May, all of our KS3 students spent time crafting poems to submit to the Delta Poetry competition. Year 7 wrote poems in response to the big question "What qualities allow people to survive in difficult circumstances?" Students then wrote a poem to submit to inspire positivity in the face of challenge. In Year 8, students were asked to write a poem to answer the big question "How do you overcome adversity?". Students wrote poems that inspired courage in the face of adversity or about someone who inspired them to remain strong.

The entries from our students were overwhelming. They were heartfelt, at times amusing, and all of the highest quality.



Six entries were sent to head Office at Education Exchange, Knottingley. Pupils took part in the whole Trust Poetry Competition. June. Pupils had a lovely day with activities and guest speakers and were certainly not disappointed. Darren Simpson, writer of Scavengers, Furthermoor and The Memory Thieves, was absolutely, brilliant. He was so inspiring as he spoke about his inspirations and answered students' questions. This was followed by a marvellously entertaining session from Rob the poetry rapper! All 100+ students in the auditorium wrote raps and two of our students got up and performed theirs on stage.

We were overjoyed and very proud of the results of the students who travelled back to The Vale Academy joyous and feeling very inspired.

# **Music Summer Spectacular**
